ALTER Michał (1890–1942), trader, city councillor, education activist. He was the son of Fajwel (1853-1927), who was a member of the *Chewra Tehilim*, and Perla née Besterman, the brother of Zygmunt (1884-1912), Samuel and \rightarrow Bernard.

Alter was a trader. He belonged to *Farejnikte* (United). In 1919, on behalf of that group, he stood for the Częstochowa City Council. He was unsuccessful but, in that same year, he became a councillor, replacing → Józef Finkelsztajn.

He was a social activist. From 1907, he belonged to the Society for the Promotion Education in Częstochowa. In 1916, together with his brother Samuel, he was co-founder of the Indigent Schoolchildren Support Section of the Society for the Promotion Education Amongst Jews. He was a member of the Częstochowa committee of the Jewish educational organisation CISzO (*Centrale Jidisze Szuł-Organizacje*). He lived at ul. Strażacka 10. He died during the liquidation of the Częstochowa ghetto (September-October 1942).
