ALTMAN Samuel (1879-), a merchant, Zionist and social activist and a member of the Jewish *gmina*. He was born on 8th June 1879 in Częstochowa, the son of Dawid Lejbuś (circa 1848 - 1907 Sosnowiec), an innkeeper, and Gitla née Frajermauer (-1916 Sosnowiec), brother of Bronisław Berek (30th October 1877 Częstochowa -) and Rachmiel.

Altman was a petty merchant, running a shop (presumably) at ul. Aleksandrowska 14 (Wilsona). He was involved in Zionist activities and sat on the board of the "Agudas Ha'tzyonim" Zionist Association. In 1919, he cofounded (with, among others, \rightarrow Szmerek Chajutin and \rightarrow Józef Szlezyngier) "Achdus" Cooperative (at ul. Ogrodowa 22). He belonged to the Society for the Promotion of Knowledge Amongst Jews. In 1916, on behalf of that Society, he co-founded the Section for the Support of School Youth. He belonged to the board of the Jewish *Gmina* in Częstochowa.

His wife was Liba née Tajchner (1st January 1895 Żarnowiec-), the daughter of Jakub and Hendla née Fajner.
