

BERNSTEIN Nissen Ozjasz (1904-1942), doctor. He was born on 10th November 1904 in Jezierna near Zborów, the son of Berl and Chana née Spatz.

He graduated from the Medical Faculty of the University Strasbourg. On 13th June 1935, he received his degree in medical science, which was presented in 1936. He specialised in internal medicine, gynaecology and midwifery. He also performed medical analyses. He settled in Częstochowa in 1937, his practice located at II Aleja 20 (on the right side of the building, on the first floor). He was a member of the Częstochowa Medical Association.

At the beginning of the war (in September 1939?), he left for the eastern Kresy [Borderlands] and spent the beginnings of the occupation in Zborów. He returned to Częstochowa, most probably, in 1941 and lived at ul. Wilsona 34. He died, having been shot by the Germans, either on 20th October 1942 in Radomsko or on 20th November 1942 in Częstochowa.

His wife was Małka née Zylberberg, previously Messer. They had a daughter Ruth (13th Jan 1938 Częstochowa-). Both his wife and daughter survived the war.
