BLUM Ignacy Icchak (1902–1942?), attorney. He was born on 6th July 1902 in Częstochowa, the son of Sandel, a trader, and Dwojra Rajzel née Cymerman. The family lived in Częstochowa, after which they moved to Żarki for a few years. In 1913, his father ran a textile shop in Częstochowa (at Nowy Rynek 6, in 1938 at ul. Prosta 3).

In Częstochowa, he attended the local community's Jewish Gimnazjum, from which he was one of the first graduates. He then began to study law at the Jagiellonian University, from which, in June 1927, he graduated with a Master's degree. In March 1928, he became an intern at the Warsaw Court of Appeal. After passing his examinations and taking the oath, in November 1933, he opened a legal practice in Radomsko (at ul. Brzeźnicka 1 and, in 1939, at ul. Kościuszki 10). During the German occupation, he lived with his family in Radomsko. The entire family perished during the Holocaust, most probably in 1942.

His wife was Laja née Gitler, who whom he had a son Aleksander (1939?-)
