BLUMENFELD Gustaw (1890-1940), soctor, reserve officer. He was born on 29^{th} May 1890 in Częstochowa, the son of Chil (1857-1918), a merchant, and Gustawa Gitla née Mendelsohn, previously Kohn (26^{th} October 1854 Częstochowa-), brother of \rightarrow Adolf, Dawid (1886-) and Perla (1888-), married to \rightarrow Gustaw Weinberg.

Circa 1909, he graduated from the government Boys' Gimnazjum in Częstochowa. He then graduated in medicine at the University of Graz (Austria), receiving his medical degree on 15 December 1923, a degree recognised by the University of Warsaw. In 1917-18, he served in the Austrian Army. From January 1921 to August 1922, with the rank of Second Lieutenant in the health service, he served in the Polish Army. He then worked at the District Hospital in Kielce, (as a doctor) in the guard battalion in Częstochowa, then in the 23rd Infantry. After transferring to the reserve, he was assigned to the reserve staff of the 1st District Hospital.

To the end of the 1920s, he practised as a doctor in Częstochowa (he lived at ul. Kościuszki 34). He later moved to Irena (in the Puławy District). There, he worked as a doctor in the local Health Fund (a branch of the Health Fund in Lublin).

He was mobilised into the Polish Army in 1939. On 17th September, he was taken prisoner by the Soviets and held in the NKVD camp in Starobielsk. He was murdered in Charków, and was buried there. Following an exhumation, he was buried in a fraternal grave (from 2000, the Polish War Cemetery in Charków).
