

BRATMAN Efroim (1910-), attorney. He came from Praszka, the son of Michał Chaim (1880-1942?) and Chaja née Wajnrajch. (In Częstochowa, they lived at Nowy Rynek 12 and, here, they sold hard skins.)

At the beginning of the 1930s (in 1934?), he graduated in law. He was, at that time, connected with Częstochowa. He was active in Grossman's Revisionist Movement. In 1933, he was a member of the command structure of the newly-founded youth organisation Brit Ha'Kanaim. He survived World War II, after which he was registered on the list of survivors in Częstochowa where he practised as an attorney. He emigrated on 2nd September 1948 and was removed from the register of attorneys.
