

**BRONIATOWSKI** Henryk Chaskiel (1878-1903), assistant to a sworn advocate. He was born on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1878 in Częstochowa, the son of Ludwik Aron Juda Lejb (1852-1895), who ran a haberdashery shop and also traded in paraffin oil, and Chaja Jetta née Zilberminc.

He attended the government Boys Gimnazjum in Częstochowa. (In 1893, he was in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade.) Presumably, he matriculated from that same gimnazjum. He graduated in legal studies and worked, in Częstochowa, as an assistant to a sworn advocate. He belonged to the “Dobroczynność” Charitable Society for Jews.

He died on 25<sup>th</sup> June 1903 in Częstochowa. As the Piotrków “Tydzień” wrote, he died “in the middle of his professional work”. He was buried in the Jewish cemetery (grave 306 II).
