

**CHAJUTIN** Pola Perla (1912-1943) doctor. She was born on 18<sup>th</sup> March 1912 in Częstochowa, the daughter of Wolf Ber Rozenzaft and Ruchla née Sztajnic. Her father ran a haberdashery and toys warehouse at ul. Wieluńska 9, which was where they lived.

In 1930, she graduated from the Association of Jewish Secondary School's *gimnazjum* in Częstochowa. In Pisa (Italy), she studied medicine and, in the autumn of 1936, she received her medical degree.

She probably only returned to Częstochowa in 1939. In 1941, she was forced, by the Germans, to live into the local ghetto. In the "Small Ghetto", she lived in a doctor's house at ul. Mostowa 9. She perished, on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1943, in the mass execution of Jewish intelligentsia at the Jewish cemetery in Częstochowa, and rests in that cemetery in a common grave.

Her husband (from 26<sup>th</sup> August 1939) was Nikodem Naum Chajutin (19<sup>th</sup> April 1907-1942), the son of Mojżesz and Eleonora Natalia née Flatau. In 1939, at the beginning of the war with the Germans, found himself in Białystok, which was occupied by the Red Army. As a communist, he became an inspector for the state-owned Gosbank bank. He perished there in 1942, killed by the Germans. He was the nephew of → Szymon Chajutin.
