## **Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit**

The history of the Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit as an organisation - and especially as a landsmannschaft - cannot be evaluated only in the light of its momentary present existence, but through its past, historic development.

The Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit just recently celebrated its 23<sup>rd</sup> anniversary. The cornerstone, however, which was laid as the foundation for an organised *Częstochower landsmannschaft*, is already many years older.

Already 33 years ago, in 1925, the first *Częstochower* Union was founded in Detroit, by the name of the *Czenstochover and Vicinity Society*. But, due to the idealistic form of its functions, this union was only able to bring together a number of idealistic *landsleit*, but it could not become the factor for a *landsmannschaft* organisation on a broader scale.

As a result, that same *Czenstochover and Vicinity Society*, after just a few years of existence - namely from January 1925 to the end of 1928, became a *Częstochower* branch of the *Arbeiter Ring*.

During that period, the *Częstochower Arbeiter Ring* Branch 620 in Detroit was pressed against enormous difficulties - solely due to the very identification of *landsleit* with political ideologies. And after a few years of important work - from 1928 to 1932 - the *Częstochower Arbeiter Ring* Branch was dissolved.

For three and a half years, Częstochowa *landsleit* remained without an organisation. But the more dynamic and devoted activists did not, for one minute, stop thinking of organising themselves into a union.

The time finally arrived. We, the Częstochowa *landsleit* learned quite a lot from experience. Once again, we cemented and reinforced the foundation which was laid 33 years ago [and] built an expanded *landsmannschaft*.

Together with the yearning for the *Old Home*, Częstochowa, which the first founders possessed, we combined the actual local day-to-day reality and a harmonious cohesion was formed. Częstochowa *landsleit* became active and, in February 1935, the Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit was founded.

In its past 23 years of existence, the Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit has had a great many notable activities. These activities were diversified. We supported institutions in our former hometown - Częstochowa - and concurrently helped the various local, and also national, Jewish bodies here. Besides that, we also did not forget our own close friends and we aided those *landsleit* who were in need of help.

The Czenstochover Regional Union in Detroit sends aid to the organised Częstochowa *landsleute* in the Land of Israel. In gratitude for the big-hearted aid from the *Częstochowers* in Detroit, the *Częstochower landsleit* in the State of Israel have inscribed the Czenstochover [Regional] Union in Detroit in the "Golden Book" there.

The Union's current officials are Ruben Luks – President, Joel Czudno - Vice-President, Abraham Fox - Recording Secretary, Nathan Richter – Treasure, Rita Halberg - Finance Secretary, Joe and Jenny Wiatrak - Hospitality.
