The sole surviving son and brother, Bernard Fajtek, Los Angeles Kalman Fajtek – the son of Jakow-Wolf and Brajndla, and the brother of Bernard Fajtek – was born in 1898 in Pilica, near Zawiercie. In 1905, when he was barely 7 years old, he came with his parents to Częstochowa. In 1914, when the Germans occupy Częstochowa, and take men to forced labour in the coal mines of Germany, he is also



taken to work at the Lahrhütte [?] coal mine. In 1918, he goes into service to help liberate Poland, and distinguishes himself in all the battles. After serving for several years, he returns home. He marries Róża [Rajzla] Cybulman; they have two children. Until the nemesis of the Jewish People arrives in Częstochowa, and he, with his wife Róża and their two children Liba and Fajwe'le, share the fate of the tens of thousands of other Jews in the gas-chambers of Treblinka.
