The Activity of the Czenstochover and Vicinity Aid Society in Los Angeles, CA.



There are around 40,000 Jews in Los Angeles, a very large proportion of whom live and breathe with the spirit of the *Old Home*. The Czenstochover and Vicinity Aid Society plays quite a significant role in social life here. We are part of the following institutions, which we support generously - Mount Sinai Hospital, City of Hope, the [California] Home for the Aged in Reseda, CA. and the Council for Jewish Organisations. We also contribute our annual share to the United Jewish Welfare Fund.

Our Society was founded in 1944. Our membership does not consist solely of *Częstochowers* - we have *landsleit* from Warsaw, Łódź, Nowo Radomsko, Kielce and also other cities. Our society has become deeply naturalised into local Jewish life and is considered an important institution. Nevertheless, we have not, for one minute, severed our ties with our *landsleit* on the other side of the ocean. We maintain close contact with *Częstochower landsleit* in Poland, Israel and Paris and, from time to time, we send our modest aid to that same sister organisation in Paris.
