FLAMENBAUM Jakub Jankiel Chaim (-1927), communist activist, city councillor.

He belonged to the Polish Communist Party (KPP). He was nominated (as one of three KPP members) to the list (No. 8) of the Left-Wing Class Trade Unions (LKZZ) in elections to the Częstochowa City Council. In December 1925, he entered the City Council.

On the night of 9th March 1926, he was arrested by the police (together with two LKZZ board members - Michał Gawron and Antoni Pietrzykowski). He was removed as a city councillor. Flamenbaum was imprisoned in Piotrków Trybunalski. The result of his trial, before the local court, resulted in him being sentenced (along with seven other members of the KPP in Częstochowa) to three years imprisonment, with hard labour, for communist activities. In June 1927, due to a serious lung disease, he was granted leave from his sentence. He died in Częstochowa (?) in August of that same year.

Flamenbaum had a wife and a child.
