

**FOGELBAUM** Julian Jakub (1900-1940), doctor, reserve officer, community activist. He was born in Warsaw on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1900, the son of → Tobiasz and Regina née Blausztajn.

Fogelbaum attended the state Boys' Gimnazjum in Częstochowa and, in 1916-18, he attended the Wincenty Szudejko Gimnazjum, matriculating in 1918. In that same year, he began studying medicine at the University of Warsaw. In November 1918, he joined the Academic Legion and later served in the Polish Army. From October 1919 to January 1920, he was sent on a military medical course. In 1921, he was transferred to the 21<sup>st</sup> Infantry Regiment. He was demobilised in 1925. With the rank of second lieutenant in the reserve health service, he was trained in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sanitary Battalion, in 1930 in the 5<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion and, in 1932, in the Sanitary Training Centre. He was assigned to the backup staff of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Hospital.

In 1928, he graduated in his medical studies at the University of Warsaw, receiving his diploma on 10<sup>th</sup> May 1928. He belonged to the Jewish Medical Society of the University of Warsaw. He returned to Częstochowa (joining his parents there). From 28<sup>th</sup> September 1928, as a urologist, he worked in the County Health Fund and also conducted a private practice. He lived at ul. Waszyngtona 39a. From the beginning of the 1930s, he lived at ul. Kościuszki 25 and from 1937, at ul. Kilińskiego 28. He belonged to the Częstochowa branch of the Polish Red Cross and participated in their pro-health campaigns.

In 1939, he was mobilised into the Polish Army and, from 17<sup>th</sup> September 1939, became a Soviet prisoner. He was held in the camp on Starobielsk. He was murdered by the NKVD in Charków and was buried there. Following exhumation, in 2000, his body was moved into fraternal grave in the Polish War Cemetery.
