FREUND Ludwik (1887-), commercial entrepreneur, consigner, social and charitable activist. He was born on 13^{th} June 1887 in Praszka, the son of \rightarrow Izydor and Mariem, brother of Wilhelma.

He worked in Częstochowa as a consignor. He was co-owner (with his father) and, later, owner of the tenement at ul. Kościuszki 16. Like his father and brother, he participated in charitable activities. He supported Mina Werde Home for the Aged and Orphans. During World War I, from at least November 1914, he was active in the Emergency Aid Committee (including being a donor to the organisation). In 1919, together with his brother Wilhelm and \rightarrow Stanisław Wiernik, he ran the "Globus" Department Store (at ul. Kościuszki 7).

His wife was Halina.
