**FRYDMAN** Abram Zukan (1879–1934), craftsman, crafts and Jewish self-government activist. He was born in Pławno, the son of Lewek and Perla née Hauptman.

Frydman was a tailor, running a women's clothing and fur workshop in Częstochowa (at II Aleja 24, where he lived). He was a crafts activist, a long-time member of the Tailor's Guild and a board member of the Częstochowa Jewish Craftsmen's Association. He also belonged to the Central Committee of the Craftsmen's Union. In the second half of the 1920s, he represented the Craftsmen's Union on the board and, in the 1930s, as a senior member of the council of the Jewish Religious Community.

He died on 30<sup>th</sup> or 31<sup>st</sup> July 1934 in Częstochowa and was buried in the local Jewish cemetery (grave No. 960 I).

His wife was Rywka née Rajberg with whom he had a daughter Lila.
