GALSTER Jerzy (1918-1943), medical student, Jewish policeman. He was born on 4^{th} December 1918 in Częstochowa, the son of \rightarrow Maurycy and Eugenia Rebeka née Miętkiewicz.

In 1937, he graduated from the H. Sienkiewicz No.1 State Gimnazjum in Częstochowa. He began medical studies at university in Brussels. (He completed two years of study.)

At the outbreak of World War II, he was in Poland. From 27th May 1941, he served in the Order Service (Jewish police) in Częstochowa and was a paramedic/orderly in the First District. In 1943, he worked in the hospital barracks in the HASAG-Pelcery camp. On the night of 19th July 1943, in the factory, he was chosen in a "selection", for writing a work release for a Jewish labourer. Together with his wife, on 20th July 1943, he was shot in a mass execution at the Jewish Cemetery.
