

GOLDSTEIN Maksymilian Markus (circa 1857-1910), merchant, director and board member of financial institutions, communal activist, philanthropist. He was the son of Julian.

He was the owner of a fur shop and tailoring shop at I Aleja 16. He served as managing director of the Częstochowa Mutual Loan Society and was the founder and, later, board member of the Second Częstochowa Loan & Savings Society.

He ran a warehouse containing furs, as well as men's and women's clothing, at II Aleja 16. In 1907, he was the founder, then president (1907-1910) as well as honorary member of the Commercial & Industrial Workers Mutual Aid Society. Within that society, he established the Widows and Orphans Fund.

He was communally active. He belonged to the "Lira" Musical-Literary Society. The Society for Spreading Knowledge, and the Volunteer Fire Brigade. He financially supported charitable organisations.

In the first half of 1910, for several months, he sought medical treatment abroad. In Częstochowa, he lived at ul. Mikołajewska 10 (Strażacka). He died on 30th July 1910 in Częstochowa and was buried in the Jewish cemetery.

His wife was Jadwiga née Lilienstern. Presumably, she had no children.
