

HALLEMAN Mojżesz (1898–1943), doctor, graduate in medical science.

On 4th July 1927, he received his degree from the Faculty of Medicine at the Jagiellonian University. He specialised in gynaecology and obstetrics. He worked as a doctor in hospitals in Vienna and then, later, at the St. Lazarus Hospital and Midwives School in Kraków.

From November 1929, as a doctor for the County Health Fund in Częstochowa, he saw patients at the outpatients clinic in Gnaszyn (now a suburb of Częstochowa). He was also an industrial doctor. Also, as an internal medicine doctor, he ran a private practice. In Częstochowa, he lived at al. Kościuszki 14. At the end of the 1930s, he lived at ul. Katedralna 7. He was a member of the Częstochowa branch of the Polish Red Cross.

During the German occupation, in 1941, he was forced to live inside the Częstochowa ghetto. After the mass deportations in September and October 1942, with his family, he lived in the “Small Ghetto”. He was murdered in the mass execution of the Jewish intelligentsia, on 20th March 1943, at the Jewish cemetery. He was buried in the mass grave No. 28–31 III.

His wife was Maria Mariema née Fajner (→ Maria Halleman). The couple had a son Jan (26th May 1936 Częstochowa - 1943). His wife and son were also executed on 20th March 1943.
