

JARECKI Chil (1891–), workers activist. He was born on 30th June 1891 in Częstochowa, the son of Jankiel, a Bund activist prior to 1914, and Rywka née Bem.

His brother Maurycy Moszek (1889-1920), a Bund activist, a representative of the company Jarecki & Widawski in Kalisz, was arrested on 30th September 1911 in Częstochowa. His brother Nuchim (1887–), a shopkeeper, was arrested on 29th March 1907 in Warsaw and was accused of being a member of the Zionist-Socialist Workers' Party. He later belonged to the Bund. According to information from the gendarmes, he was a member of that party's combat organisation.

Jarecki lived, with his brothers and father, in Częstochowa at Nowy Rynek 11 (pl. Daszyńskiego). Initially, he belonged to the *Poalei Zion* party. On 29th March 1907, he was arrested together with his brother Nuchim. Later, from circa 1911, together with his brothers Nuchim and Moszek, and their father Jankiel, he belonged to the Bund in Częstochowa. He was the leading activist of this party in Częstochowa.
