JELENIEWICZ Aleksander Abram (circa 1869–1910), factory director.

Jeleniewicz was a Russian Jew. After coming to the Kingdom of Poland, he lived in the Siedlce governate. In Częstochowa, he was director of the "Metalurgia" factory, owned by the Peltzer family. In 1905, at the beginning of the revolution, he left for Russia, fearing that his life would be in danger. In 1906, he returned to Częstochowa, continuing to hold the position of director of "Metalurgia" (which, in 1906, became the property of Karol Graux). He lived on the Peltzer factory property.

He died in a treacherous attack on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1910 in Częstochowa and was buried in the local Jewish cemetery.

His wife was Ewa Chawa née Botkowska (1873 Bielsko–). They had a daughter Maria (24<sup>th</sup> July 1895 Kolno-) and son Aleksander (22<sup>nd</sup> December 1896 Kolno-).
