

LANDAU Salomon (1848–1903), merchant, industrialist. He was born on 24th April 1848 in Częstochowa, the son of Szaja and Częstochowa-born Maria née Kohn.

In 1873, he moved to Łódź, where he became co-owner of Wilhelm Ginsberg's company and a representative of the Zawiercie Stock Company. He was a member of the Council of the Bank Handlowy and of the discount committee of the State Bank. He was a senior of the Merchants' Assembly and, from 1899, vice-president of the Łódź Jewish Charitable Society.

He died on 12th April 1903 in Merana. He was buried in Łódź in the cemetery on ul. Bracka (side P, quarter J, grave No. 56).

In 1874, in Warsaw, he married Helena Chaja née Korngold (1852 – 15th July 1927). On the occasion of their silver wedding anniversary, he donated 10,000 rubles towards a craft school in the *Talmud Torah*.
