LEWKOWICZ Roman Abram (1891-?), lawyer. He was born on 4^{th} July 1891 in Częstochowa, the son of Anszel Hersz Lewkowicza and Dobra née Szumacher. Uncle of \rightarrow Leon Lewkowicz.

In 1918, he began studies in the Faculty of Law and, in 1921, in the Faculty of Philosophy of the Jagiellonian University. He gained the title of "Doctor of Laws". In 1928, he ran a law practice in Częstochowa – at II Aleja 41 and, in 1930, at III Aleja 49). In 1928, he worked in a joint law firm with lawyers \rightarrow Samuel Wajntraub and trainee lawyer \rightarrow Paweł Meitlis. In the 1930s, he ran a law office in Wieluń (at ul. Kaliska 6).

At the beginning of the German occupation, he returned to Częstochowa and, in March 1940, lived at ul. Berka Joselewicza 6.
