MAMLOK (MAMELOK) Ludwik Lajzer (circa 1861-1903), merchant, entrepreneur, factory co-owner, social worker. Born in Płock.

At least from the first half of the 1880s, Mamlok lived with his family in Płock. In 1894, he moved to Częstochowa where, from 1885, together with Borensztajn, he ran the Ludwik Mamlok & Company Częstochowa Asphalt and Tarboard Factory Enterprise, at ul. Zielona 9 (Focha 13/15). The factory's products (including refractory tarboard and insulation boards) were presented during the Industry and Agriculture Exhibition in 1909 in Częstochowa.

Mamlok was a member of the Society for the Spreading of Knowledge (TSzW), as well as the "Dobroczynność" Charitable Society for Jews (TDdŻ), to which he was also a donor.

He died on 2nd January 1903 in Częstochowa and was buried in the local Jewish cemetery.

His wife was Estera Maria née Morensztajn (18^{th} November 1862 Duninów near Włocławek – 24^{th} November 1922 Częstochowa), active in both the TSzW and the TDdŻ. (She took part in performances in support of the Society.) They had at least four children:

- \rightarrow Jakub,
- Leontyna (20th September 1833 Płock 1922 Leningrad),
- Zofia (1888–), married to Adam Słowiński,
- Felicja (1890–), who worked in the TSzW library, and
- Rebeka Regina, married to → Stefan Korngold, a SDKPi activist who, in 1912, was arrested for her political activity, later a dentist in Częstochowa.
