MARGULIES Maksymilian Norbert (1911–?), doctor. He was born on 24^{th} September 1911 in Sołotwin (Nadwórna District, Stanisławowskie Province), the younger son of teacher \rightarrow Wilhelm Wolf Margulies and Berta née Weisman.

He attended the Traugutt No.2 State Gimnazjum in Częstochowa, matriculating in 1930. He gained his medical degree in 1937 at the Jagiellonian University. At that time, he was also a cadet paramedic. He was then an intern at the clinic of Prof. Tempka and Prof. Zubrzycki in Kraków. He was probably awarded his doctorate at that time. In 1938, he practised in Kraków (at ul. Syrokomli 15).

In 1939, he moved to Żarki. He still lived there at the beginning of the occupation (at Alter Ring 5). Probably, during the liquidation of the Żarki ghetto, in the autumn of 1942, that he ended up in the HASAG camp in Skarżysko-Kamienna. In 1944, together with the other Jewish prisoners, he was taken to the HASAG-Pelcery camp in Częstochowa (camp No. 4720).

Probably, on 15th or 16th January 1945, he was taken to a camp in Germany. His further fate is unknown.
