MARKOWICZ Daniel (1902–1942), lawyer, sports activist, football referee. He was the son of Józef and Małka.

In 1920, he graduated from the H. Sienkiewicz No.1 State Gimnazjum in Częstochowa. He later studied law. From 1933, he ran a legal practice in Częstochowa (initially at ul. Katedralna 20 and, from the second half of the 1930s, at II Aleja 20).

He was active in sports. He contributed to the development of the "Warta" Częstochowa Sports Club, where he was also a board member. From 1928, he sat on the board of the Częstochowa Football Sub-District. From 1933, he served as vice-president of the "Makabi" Jewish Gymnastics and Sports Association. From 1934, as a football referee, he served on the board of the Kielce Regional Referees College. In that same year, he was a delegate of the region to the general meeting of the Polish Referees College. He also belonged to the committee (established in 1924) which looked after the municipal pitch.

Presumably, in September 1939, he found himself in the Polish eastern *kresy* [borderlands]. He was arrested in 1942, and was shot by the Germans in Wilno.

His wife was Chawa née Ickowicz (1912-1942), with whom he had a son Aleksander (1939-1942).
