MARKOWICZ Mieczysław (Dawid Majer?) (9 VI 1887?-), industrialist, factory director. He was the son of Markus Mordka, co-owner of a colonial goods and wines warehouse, and Salomea Sura née Flatau, brother of → Zygmunt.

Markowicz was co-owner of the Gnaszyński Ceramics Factory, shareholder (together with → Zygmunt Markowicz and → Roman Markowicz) and managing director of the Gnaszyński Wallpaper and Coloured Paper Factory. W 1935-1936, he belonged to the Audit Committee of the Częstochowa District Industrialists Association.

Prior to 1st September 1939, he lived in Częstochowa. He survived the German occupation. From January 1945, he worked in the Manufaktura Gnaszyńska as director. "Głos Narodu" wrote, "Director Markowicz, with the same enthusiasm as before, provides the factory with his services as an excellent specialist and manager".

In 1946 (?), he left for the United States.

His wife was Helena née Lipska (7<sup>th</sup> October 1890 Częstochowa-). They had a son Marek (circa 1930-).
