This photo was taken in 1962, when Regina Lewkowicz visited her father, Reb Szlojme Krakowski, in Israel Regina was born to Reb Szlojme, may his light shine<sup>2</sup>, and Perl z"l in Nowo Radomsko, from where she fled to Częstochowa during the Nazi period. She was barracked in HASAG-Pelcery and liberated in Częstochowa on the night from 16<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> January 1945.

In the times of the Nazi massacres in Częstochowa, her mother, five sisters and one brother were deported to Treblinka, where they perished in sanctification of the Name [of God] and the People [of Israel].

Her father and two brothers, Jakow-Icek and Dawid-Lajb, who lived through the period of Nazi tyranny in Częstochowa, live with their families in Israel.

In 1946, in Częstochowa, Regina married Mojsze Lewkowicz and they arrived in Canada in 1948. The Lewkowicz couple have two

young daughters - Pearl and Miriam.

Regina Lewkowicz is active in the Ladies Auxiliary and assists in all the Society's works.
