

PANKOWSKI Natan Nott (1841–1907), merchant, social and religious activist. He was born in Krzepice, the son of Dawid (1812-) and Fajgla (1815-).

In the 1880s, Pankowski ran a shop in Częstochowa, stocked with colonial [imported] goods and wines. He owned his own home. He belonged to the synagogue supervision and was also a representative of the Chassidim.

At the turn of the 20th century, he headed the society which, for the education of poor Jewish children, paid teachers at religious schools.

At the end of the 1880s, he lived at II Aleja 46.

His first wife was Gitla née Diament (circa 1842 - 1905 Wrocław), with whom he had a daughter Chaja (24th March 1862 Częstochowa-). His second wife was Rejla (Rela) née Białogłowski (1872 Piotrków) 1 vel. Rawicka.
