

**PRUSICKI** Stanisław Salomon (1876–1942?), accountant, bank director, social activist. He was born on 8<sup>th</sup> August 1876 in Częstochowa, the son of Maurycy Mojżesz and Estera Masza (-1935) née Zilbermenc, brother of Józef.

By profession, Prusicki was an accountant. He held the position of director of the Jewish Industrialist and Merchant Cooperative Bank (at II Aleja 22) in Częstochowa. He was also a member of that bank's board and council.

During World War I, in August 1916, he took part in a meeting of property owners in Częstochowa, at which a committee was chosen to discuss property taxes with the German authorities. He was active communally. From 1906, he belonged to the Society for the Spreading of Knowledge (TSzW), where he sat on that organisation's library committee and managed the TSzW premises. From 1935, he belonged to the board of the Building Construction Committee for the Jewish Community School.

In 1939, he lived at ul. Waszyngtona 18. He was employed by the Council of Elders [*Judenrat*] in Częstochowa, heading the Supply Department. He perished during the German occupation.

His wife was Ruchla née Bryl (19<sup>th</sup> December 1886 Częstochowa – 4<sup>th</sup> June VI 1939 Częstochowa), the daughter of Natan and Szajndla née Praskiewicz (who managed the orphanage of the "Dobroczytność" Charitable Society for Jews). Ruchla was the sister of → Adolf Bryl.
