ROZEN (ROSEN) Marceli Mordko (1891–1940), doctor. He was born on 18th March 1891 in Węgrów, the son of Matys, a Hebrew teacher in Warsaw.

On 8th June 1911, he matriculated from the No.2 Gimnazjum in Warsaw. In 1911-1911-1914, he was a student in the Faculty of Medicine at Lwów University. From 1915, he studied in the Faculty of Medicine at the Jagiellonian University. He received his medical diploma on 9th July 1919. He completed his specialisation in clinics in Berlin.

As a dermatologist and venereologist, from 1922, he practised in Częstochowa. He lived at II Aleja 41 and, in 1939, at III Aleja 46). He was a consultant physician at the hospital of the "Dobroczynność" Charitable Society for Jews and was also active in the Polish Red Cross.

In 1930, he joined the board of the Association of Jewish Property Owners. As a reserve lieutenant (gaining the rank on 1st June 1919), in the event of an outbreak of war, he was assigned to the back-up staff of the 4th District Hospital.

In 1940 (?), he left for Kraków, where he died on 2nd November 1940.
