

ROZENSZTAJN (ROZENSTEIN) Natan Nachman Aron (1905-1943), lawyer, sports activist. He was born on 5th July 1905 in Częstochowa, the son of Chaim Salomon, a trader, and Sura née Horowicz.

In 1927, Rozensztajn graduated from the Law Faculty of Warsaw University. In 1934, after completing his legal internship, he passed the examination at the Bar Council in Warsaw. From 1935, he ran a legal practice in Częstochowa, at pl. Daszyńskiego 4 m 5).

He was active in sports. In 1934, while still a legal intern, he belonged to the board and chaired the Discipline Committee of the "Makabi" Gymnastics-Sports Association.

On 15th July 1935, he was attacked in Staszic Park, in Częstochowa, by a group of nationalists. He was wounded with a knife and was treated in hospital.

On 4th January 1943, along with twenty-four other people, he was shot by the Germans on the Rynek Warszawski (at the intersection of ul. Warszawska and ul. Nadrzeczna). Together with the other victims, he was buried in a mass grave at the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery (grave-monument No. 1220 I).
