SANDZER Józef Izaak (1910–1943?), a lawyer intern in Częstochowa. He was born on 4th November 1910 in Łódź, the son of Szymon and Bajla née Bugajer.

He lived in Łódź. In 1932, he graduated from the Law Department of the University of Warsaw, as a Master of Laws. He became an intern lawyer through the Łódź District Court and was a sworn translator from Hebrew and Yiddish (jargon). In 1937, he was a sworn translator from Hebrew and Yiddish (jargon) in Częstochowa (ul. Panny Marii 11) through the Piotrików District Court.

During the war, he lived in Lwów. He died in 1943 (?), together with his wife. In the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery, on the Bugajer grave (No. 1048 II), there is a symbolic inscription dedicated to Sandzer and his wife. There is a similar inscription of the grave of Józef Bugajer Suchoński in the Warsaw Jewish Cemetery (Sector 7, row 2, grave No. 13).

His wife, from Częstochowa, was the lawyer Maryla Sandzer née Bugajer (circa 1916-1943?), the daughter of Józef and Udla née Haftka.
