

SZEJGIN Izaak Ejzyk (1868-1939), felczer [paramedic, barber-surgeon]. He was born on 28th May 1868 in Częstochowa, the son of Zelik and Małka née Ejlenberg.

In 1902, he graduated from felczer school. Prior to 1914, he was one of twenty-eight felczers in Częstochowa. He was one of the more well-known Jewish felczers. He practised at ul. Piłsudskiego 2 and lived at ul. Warszawska 54.

Following the entry of the Germans into Częstochowa, on 4th September 1939 ("Bloody Monday"), he was pulled out of his home and shot (together with H. Kolin - owner of a shop and grain warehouse) at ul. Warszawska 60. Together with Kolin, he was buried on ul. Tartakowa, near the place where he perished.

In 1899, he married Laja née Blejwas (31st October 1879 Łódź-), the daughter of Pinkus and Maria née Epszajn. They had four children:

- Róża (16th January 1901 Częstochowa-),
- Salomea (4th March 1902 Częstochowa-),
- Michał (15th January 1903 Częstochowa-),
- Adolfa (13th February 1904 Częstochowa-).
