

SZLEZYNGER (SZLEZYNGIER) Józef (1880–), owner of a craft workshop, social activist. He was born on 13th July 1880 in Częstochowa, the son of Lajzer and Sura (Salomea) née Praport, the brother of Mošek Dawid, a merchant (13th August 1880 Częstochowa-), Zyndel, a merchant (17th December 1877 Częstochowa-) and Bernard, a merchant (17th May 1885 Żarnów-).

Szlezyngier worked in Częstochowa, initially as a factory worker. After a certain time, he established his own workshop. In June 1919, he was the founder and, later, a board member of the “Achdus” Cooperative in Częstochowa. In 1936, he was a member of the Committee to Build a Jewish Gymnazjum in Częstochowa.

His wife was Ruchla née Tenenbaum (1885 Częstochowa-). They had two daughters - Marianna (1908 Częstochowa-) and Ita (1911 Częstochowa-).
