They were known in our city
for their honesty and their devotion to
public needs and, particularly,
in aiding the poor.

Reb Yidl – as everyone called him – was
endowed with a warm Jewish heart. He
performed deeds for those lacking
livelihood and devoted his time to public
needs, in order to establish institutions
of charity and goodwill and extend aid to
the needy.

Also his wife **Ruchel**, who was the daughter of a great Torah scholar,
the Halachic authority, Reb Mordche Sarecki z"l from the town of Gorzkowice (next to Sosnowiec)
- was for him a "*helpmate*" and not "*against him*," for she took part in his good works
and their home on *Aleja [Najświętszej] Maryi [Panny] 4* was a house wide open to all in need of their aid.

The deceased was chief *gabay* at the *minyán* of Radomsko *Chassidim*, on ul. Warszawska 28,
which was a place of Torah, prayer and charity.

On the bitter and tragic day of the Great Expulsion from the Częstochowa ghetto in 1942, they were
taken by the German oppressors, together with their sons **Mojze, Szulim, and Mordche**, and their
daughter **Sura hy"d**, to the crematoriums in Treblinka, and, from there, their holy souls ascended to
Heaven.

Their eldest son **Awigdor** and their daughter **Rywka** were miraculously saved and are now in Israel.
It is they that saw it as their obligation of honour to commemorate, in the Częstochowa
Community's Memorial Book, the names of their parents, brothers and sister,
who were murdered together with the entire House of Israel of Częstochowa.

May their holy souls be bound in the Bond of Life, and their memory honoured!
