

And my mother-in-law, Mrs **Rena-Mariem** (née **Potocki**) **hy" d**

I commemorate in the Memorial Book of the Częstochowa Community the hallowed victims, which I sustained in the great destruction of the Polish Jewry by the Nazi murderers, may their name and memory be obliterated.

I lost my father **Szlojme**, and mother **Dwojra-Ruchel** (née Kopinska) **Gliksman**,

and my sisters **Libe, Frymet, and Sara**,

who were sent away to Treblinka in the first *akcja, Rosh Hashana* Eve, 5702 (1942);

my sister **Ester**, with her little three-year-old daughter **Miryam**,

[who were] sent to their deaths in the second *akcja, Sukkos* Eve, 5703 (1943);

my little 17-month-old son **Mendele** – perished on 13th Tishrei 5703 [24/09/1942], in the mass grave in the street.

In the *akcja* on *Simchas Torah* 5703, I lost the wife of my youth, **Ester-Edzia** (née Gliksman), formerly a nurse at the Jewish Hospital.

I also lost my grandfather, Reb **Mojsze Kopinski** – may God avenge their blood!
