TEICHNER (TAJCHNER) Roman (1875-1928), *felczer* [paramedic, barbersurgeon], trade union and sports activist. He was born on 13th May 1875 in Częstochowa, the son of Chaskel and Bajla née Zorgenlos.

Teichner worked as a senior *felczer* at the Blessed Virgin Mary Hospital at II Aleja 17. In 1913, he lived at I Aleja 17. He was a co-founder and member of the Union of Felczers in Częstochowa. As a *felczer*, he aided members of the local Fire Brigade.

He was active in sports. He co-founded and was board member of the Jewish Gymnastics-Sports Association and was also active in the "Warta" Częstochowa Sports Club.

He belonged to the *Gmiles Chesed*¹ society".

He died on 19th June 1928 in Częstochowa (?) and was buried in the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery. Those attending his funeral included the Mayor of Częstochowa, Romuald Jarmułowicz, doctors and representatives of sports clubs.

In 1906, in Częstochowa, he married Ruchla née Mendlowicz, the daughter of Abram and Nacha née Alter. They had three children - Henryk (1907-), Natan (1909-) and Berta (1912-).
