TEMPEL Jakub (1892-), charity and social activist. He was born on 4th January 1892 in Częstochowa, the son of Pinkus (1852-), a bookbinder, and Pessa née Szternberg.

Tempel belonged to the "Dobroczynność" Charitable Society for Jews, as well as the Society to Aid Sick and Poor Jews and was a member of the Audit Committee of "*Linas Ha'Tzedek*". From the autumn of 1914, after the outbreak of war, he was active in the Emergency Aid Committee.

In July 1915, representing the board of the *Popular Bakery*, he joined the Jewish section of the Emergency Aid Committee.
