**WAJNSZTOK** (WEINSTOK) Joachim Chaim (1881-1942), merchant, Zionist and local government activist. He was born in Pilica, the son of Jakub and Dyna née Blejwas.

Wajnsztok was a petty merchant. From 1927, he was a member of the Supervisory Board of the Industrialists and Merchants Bank in Częstochowa. He belonged to the Zionist Party and was a member of the *Agudas Ha'Cyjonim* Zionist organisation.

In 1927, on the list of the United Jewish Electoral Committee, he stood for election to the Czestochowa City Council – he was elected as a deputy councillor. Wajnsztok also sat on the board of the local Jewish Community Council.

In 1908, in Sosnowiec, he married Sara Blima (1891 Sosnowiec - 1942 Treblinka) née Wajnsztok, the daughter of Mordechaj and Gnendla née Frydman. They had four children:

- daughter Estera (1910 1942 Treblinka) and three sons,
- Daniel (1921 1942 Treblinka)
- Pinkus, who survived German occupation and
- Menachem, who survived German occupation.
