**WARMUND** Wolf (1914-1943), doctor. He was born on 6<sup>th</sup> March 1914 in Częstochowa, the son of Izaak Josef (1888 Janów - 1942 Treblinka), a timber trader in Częstochowa at ul. Kościuszki 23 (in 1939, at ul. Katedralnej 8 and who had a timber and building materials warehouse at ul. 1 Maja), and Ita née Szajów (23<sup>rd</sup> December 1886 Częstochowa - 1942 Treblinka), brother of Josek Icek (6<sup>th</sup> January ? 1916 Częstochowa – 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1941 Nowe Bruśno) who, in 1934, representing the United Jewish Commerce Bloc, stood for election to the Częstochowa City Council, becoming a deputy councillor.

Warmund was a graduate of the Jewish Gimnazjum in Częstochowa. In 1938, he graduated from the medical faculty in Lyon, gaining the title of doctor of medicine. As an internist and gynaecologist, he ran a private practice in Horyniec near Lubaczów and then later in Częstochowa.

From 1941, the Germans forced him to live in the local ghetto. In September and October 1942, during the deportation of the Częstochowa Jews to Treblinka, he was in barracks, with his family, at ul. Garibaldiego 18. In the "Small Ghetto", he lived at ul. Mostowa 9. He was murdered by the Germans on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1943, together with his wife and two-year-old son, in the mass execution of Jewish intellectuals at the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery (grave No. 28–31 III).

His wife was Tauba née Goldminc (1912 or 1913 Częstochowa - 1943 Częstochowa) who, during the War, was in Lwów and Częstochowa. They had a son Ryszard Abram Hirsz (17<sup>th</sup> January 1941 Lwów – 20<sup>th</sup> March 1943).
