**WOLLENBERG** (WOLENBERG) Beniamin Jeremiasz (1844–1906), photographer, photographic studio owner. He was born on  $29^{th}$  March (or  $18^{th}$  May) 1844 in Częstochowa, the son of Chaim and Chana. His sister Mirla was the wife of photographer  $\rightarrow$  Moritz Arbus.

He was already a photographer in 1865. Presumably, in that same year, he worked in the photographic studio of → Moritz Arbus in Częstochowa. In 1868, he left for Turek where, in 1870, he opened a photographic store.

Upon returning to Częstochowa, in 1900, he opened a photographic store at II Aleja 38, later operating at II Aleja 40).

He died on 20<sup>th</sup> November 1906 in Częstochowa and was buried in the local Jewish cemetery (grave No. 336 II).

His wife was Gołda née Gumpricht, (1849 Kalisz – 1942), the daughter of Mojżesz and Mendla. The had a son and three daughters:

- → Maurycy Mojżesz
- Maria (1888 Konin),
- Rywka (1893 Konin),
- Helena (1895 Konin).
