**WYGNAŃSKI** Kałma (1904–1944), lawyer. He was born on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1904 in Jędrzejów, the son of Moszek and Chana née Joskowicz.

He lived in Kielce. In 1926, he graduated from the S. Wroński State Gimnazjum in Kielce. For a short time before the war, he moved to Częstochowa and, on 31<sup>st</sup> August 1939, he married a lady from Częstochowa.

During the occupation, he stayed in Częstochowa. From the beginning of 1940, he worked in the Forced Labour Department of the Council of Elders (*Judenrat*), in the Intelligence and Control Section. Following the liquidation of the "Small Ghetto", he worked in the HASAG factory camp.

He died on 10<sup>th</sup> November 1944 in Częstochowa and was buried in the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery. There is a symbolic inscription on grave No. 820 II.

In 1939, in Częstochowa, he married Krystyna née Wiener (1918-), the sister of Marian Wiener, who perished during the German occupation. They most probably had no children.
