

WYGNAŃSKI Kałma (1904–1944), lawyer. He was born on 11th November 1904 in Jędrzejów, the son of Moszek and Chana née Joskowicz.

He lived in Kielce. In 1926, he graduated from the S. Wroński State Gimnazjum in Kielce. For a short time before the war, he moved to Częstochowa and, on 31st August 1939, he married a lady from Częstochowa.

During the occupation, he stayed in Częstochowa. From the beginning of 1940, he worked in the Forced Labour Department of the Council of Elders (*Judenrat*), in the Intelligence and Control Section. Following the liquidation of the “Small Ghetto”, he worked in the HASAG factory camp.

He died on 10th November 1944 in Częstochowa and was buried in the Częstochowa Jewish Cemetery. There is a symbolic inscription on grave No. 820 II.

In 1939, in Częstochowa, he married Krystyna née Wiener (1918-), the sister of Marian Wiener, who perished during the German occupation. They most probably had no children.
