

ZAJDMAN Fiszel Efraim (1839–1939), antiquarian. He was the son of Jakub Juda. He lived in Częstochowa at ul. Spadek 18 (from 1932, called ul. Garibaldię).

For several dozen years, Zajdman, who had the nickname “Ciapa”, ran an antiques shop. According to the “Express Częstochowski”, “In Russian times, [Zajdman’s] antique shop was popular among the young people”.

In 1930, he was sued, alleging that he had purchased a stolen book.

He died on 21st January 1939 in Częstochowa and was buried in the local Jewish cemetery (grave No. 2415 B I).
